WHY THE IDEA OF AN ELLIPTIC UNIVERSE STRUCTURE?

The revelations of cosmology are of immense value because it "presents cosmic data in such a manner as to illuminate the spiritual teachings contained in the accompanying revelation." (1109:ML) A comparable description of philosophy reads:

"Philosophy dare not project its interpretations of reality in the <u>linear</u> fashion of logic; it must never fail to reckon with <u>elliptic</u> symmetry of reality and with the <u>essential</u> curvature of all relation concepts." (1137:5)

"The local universe consists of three degrees of reality manifestation: matter, mind, and spirit. The morontia angle of approach erases all divergence between the findings of the physical sciences and the functioning of the spirit of religion." (1136:3) "...therefore will religion always be characterized by paradoxes, the paradoxes resulting from the absence of the experiential connection between the material and the spiritual levels.... (1121:#3:2) But it is not paradoxical that the idea of the elliptical structure of the universe is SYMBOLIC of truth. "God is the source of truth in the mind spheres; God overshedows all in the material realms." (23:#2:1) Even man's meaning grasps and value realisations are denominated "psychic circles." Linear thinking wild never achieve high circle attainment. Truth expands circularly in mortal mind through experience. Since truth is ever widening, ever expanding circularly, it follows then that spirit values swing around the curved path in obedience to the incessant absolute pull of the gravity spirit of the Eternal Son and returns to its Paradise Source.

Rather than being mathematically round-wanting in creative imagination and beautiful complexity--the physical universe is symmetrically and truthfully elliptic. The ellipticity of truth is reflected in the pattern of the cosmos. THE COSMOS IS PATTERNED BY TRUTH.

HAS SCIENCE DISCOVERED THE ULTIMATON?

In the June 1971 issue of Scientific

American there is a most interesting article
entitled "The Structure of the Proton and the
Neutron."

The authors, Drs. Henry W. Kendall and Wolfgang K. H. Panofsky, while researching the internal structure of the atom at the Stanford University Linear Accelerator Center, have come upon startling results in the course of tests. The results indicate "the way ultrahigh-energy electrons are scattered by protons and neutrons suggest that these elementary nuclear particles have a complex internal structure consisting of pointlike entities called partons."

In Paper 42, "Energy--Mind and Matter," of the Urantia Book, the existence of the ultimaton is revealed. The ultimaton is described as a "minute sphere" and being "the first measurable form of energy" as well as "the basic unit of materialized energy."

One hundred ultimatons are required to form a typical electron. It is further stated, "The entire segregation and grouping of electronic matter, together with electric differentiation of negative and positive bodies of energy-matter (the electron and proton), result from these various functions of the component ultimatonic interassociation."

The ultimaton is the basic unit of the structure of the atom. Is the parton the ultimaton?

HOW THE URANTIA BOOK HAS INFLUENCED ME

In January 1971 I was discharged from the U. S. Army with plans to finish my college work while using the G. I. Bill. I decided not to enroll that spring, however, since I had just become interested in the Urantia Book and wanted to devote all my spare time toward studying the book. I then used the next five months to begin a serious cover to cover study of the Urantia revelation, and I quickly discovered that no other religious teaching I had come in contact was to have such a profound influence on my thoughts and actions as had the Urantia Book.

When I returned to Cal-State Fullerton in the fall of '71 I was very pleased to learn that a Department of Religious Studies was in its first years of development at CSCF. I decided then to enroll in the program and took two classes in the Religious Studies area. One of the courses, Problems in the History of Religious Thought, was divided into three major areas of study: God, Word, and Revelation. All members of the class were asked to bring in a class project which typified our comprehension of the concepts we were discussing as well as a personal statement of our own faith or beliefs. I presented readings from the Urantia Book along with a brief statement regarding the origin and history of the book with an emphasis on the Urantia Book as an example of modern day revelation.

Another class I enrolled in in the fall was called <u>Ritual and Symbol</u>, and I found that the Urantia Book was of invaluable aid in sorting out the factual information of our religious origins from the myths of our eastern and western traditions.

This semester my studies include a course entitled The Future of Religion, a seminar in anthropology called Alternative Futures, and a third class in which I am studying Jewish and Comparative Mysticism. At least five members of The Future of Religion class are Urantia Book readers, and the professor, Dr. Donald Gard, has welcomed our enthusiastic perspective. Dr. Gard, the chairman of the Religious Studies Department, is presently reading the copy that the First Urantia Society of Los Angeles donated to the Cal-State Fullerton Library.

A DEDICATED URANTIAN

Julia Fenderson stands tall among those who have dedicated many years of their lives in working for the dissemination of the truths contained in the Urantia Book. She started reading the Urantia Papers in 1939, and since the Urantia Book was published in 1955 she has read it from cover to cover many times.

When Julia came to the Los Angeles area in April 1945 she knew that several families living here had read the Urantia Papers and had been regular attendants at Dr. Sadler's study forum at 533 Diversey Parkway in Chicago. She contacted these persons and organized an informal study group on religious philosophy, discussing the world's religions.

Julia served as secretary for this little band of Urantia students, and monthly meetings and picnics were held.

On October 1, 1956, the second charter in the United States was granted to this group by the Urantia Brotherhood. Fred Squires was the first president. Julia served as secretary for many years, later as vice-president and president, and is now membership chairman.

Several years ago she was appointed Western Field Representative by the Urantia Brother-hood. She also serves on the Brotherhood Council which meets every August in Chicago. As Field Representative, her duties include visiting other study groups, assisting in the formation of new societies, and answering requests for information from new students.

During this time she has also carried on the family obligations of wife, mother, and grandmother. Now she has more time to devote to the Urantia movement which is so important in her life.

HOW THE URANTIA BOOK HAS INFLUENCED MY LIFE

I have been a student of the Urantia Book for about three and one-half years. Previous to exposure to these supernal writings, I possessed no understanding or awareness of spiritual realities. My childhood religious training had been wholly non-existent. My moral training, thanks to my loving parents, was based upon a universal brotherhood of man. However, the parentage of this brotherhood was uncertain.

As I grew and began to try to think for myself, my agnosticism evolved into atheism. This happened as a result of seeing the effects of traditional organized religion on the church members. So many of my friends who attended church regularly seemed to be enslaved and restrained from living and loving by many negative rules. This experience led me away from organized religion and because of my immaturity led me away from the search for spiritual realities suggested by the Christian religion.

As I grew into my twenties, I experienced a hunger for something inexplicable. This hunger led me to experiment with life in unusual ways. I became interested in astrology and other ideas of the occult. Along with this I began using psychedelic drugs. I found in myself a gnawing dissatisfaction with my life and a great confusion as to what my life meant, why I was here, where I was going, and what happened after death.

It was at this time I sought psychiatric help. I spent one and one-half years with a very helpful psychiatrist who did much to help me straighten my thinking.

However, I was still unsatisfied as to my basic questions concerning my destiny.

One day it occurred to me to find what Jesus had to say on these things. I knew he spoke on brotherly love but I knew nothing more of his teachings. I decided to go directly to the source of his teachings and determine for myself what this man taught over 2000 years ago. That would be of value to me. So I borrowed a copy of the Holy Bible and began to read the gospels starting with Matthew. As I read I became discouraged because my hunger was not being satisfied.

The Bible sounded so much like the religionists I had heard on radio, T.V., and elsewhere. So I abandoned the Biblical study. Like a miracle, at this very time a friend showed me a copy of the Urantia Book. I was immediately impressed and bought a copy that same day and began my intense reading.

This event marked the beginning of my entrance into the spiritual brotherhood. I began experiencing tremendous changes in my thinking concerning the existence of God and other matters. Several months after beginning reading, I was forced by the weight of my experience to accept the existence of God.

The tremendous change of belief was the direct result of reading the Urantia Book. My reading satisfied my intellectual sensibilities, my emotional needs, and my spiritual longings. Since that time my faith in the spirit realities of the heavenly kingdom has strengthened and my trust in the validity of the Urantia Book has become total.

A DEVOTED URANTIAN -- FRED H. SQUIRES

Fred H. Squires is a distinguished pioneer in the Urantia movement. In the early days in Chicago he was an ardent reader of the Papers, and later on in California he devoted himself to the work of the Urantia group on the west coast. He is a dedicated and beloved leader.

About a dozen former readers of the Urantia Papers met at Fern Dell Park in July 1945, where Fred was elected president of this first study group. This small band met about once a month through the years and studied the religions of the world-always with the hope that the book would soon be published.

The Urantia Book was finally published in 1955, and Fred immediately set up the processes of establishing our group as a Society. He applied for the second charter of the country and the world; the group met the requirements and was chartered on Oct. 2, 1956. Fred Squires was elected president of this group and is still serving as President Emeritus.

The first group was named the West Coast Urantia Society. Fred spent much of his time and money in helping newcomers who were attracted to this revelation. Fred continues to attend meetings, and when he speaks we all know that it comes from his heart and his deep insight and study of the Urantia Book over many years. --Julia Fenderson

JUNE AND JULY MEETINGS

The June meeting was three-fold. Polly Parke presented a paper, "As We Go Forward," setting forth some philosophic values for a religious school such as our School of Meanings and Values.

Nancy Hoag then presented a plan she had devised for including various types of programs meeting the needs of more people with the following aspects: business, social, intellectual, emotional, and spiritual. Later, during discussion, some members suggested a modified program that will incorporate all of these elements.

The program concluded with role playing skits by James and Pat McNelly, which demonstrated effective and ineffective ways of approaching people with the good news of the Urantia teachings. James and Pat brought out that we should look at our task in terms of whole systems with a broad understanding of why this revelation has been given to us in our present stage of evolution. Some very deep concepts were expressed, providing a take-off for questions and discussion relevant to a total philosophic approach.

At the July meeting Nancy Hoag led a discussion on the purpose of the Urantia Society and the School of Meanings and Values. There was agreement that we should keep a flexible format for the purposes of communication, fellowship, and spiritual inspiration. The idea was presented that topics bringing forth good participation and discussion should not be cut off for the purpose of conforming to a rigid agenda.

It was announced that a one-unit course based on study of the Urantia Book will be offered on Mondays from 7 to 10 p.m. at the University of California at Bakersfield starting in September. The class will be taught jointly by Drs. Robert W. Hunt and Philip Calabrese. (Interested persons please contact Julia Fenderson for further information.)

4th URANTIA TRIENNIAL DELEGATE ASSEMBLY

Every three years, each URANTIA Society of URANTIA Brotherhood chooses two of its members, one delegate and one alternate, to attend the Triennial Delegate Assembly at URANTIA Brotherhood headquarters in Chicago. The purpose of the triennial is to choose new members to the 36 member General Council of URANTIA Brotherhood, to vote on various resolutions that come before the assembly, and the reporting from each URANTIA Society of its activities over the previous three year period.

This year, the delegate from FUSLA was our current Vice-President, Scott Forsythe, and our Book Committee Chairman, Patrick McNelly, served as alternate.

Unseasonably fine weather greeted the delegates and visitors this year when the delegate assembly opened on the morning of Friday, August 3rd.

Miss E.L. Christensen, Trustee Emeritus of URANTIA Foundation and of URANTIA Brotherhood, opened the Triennial with an uplifting address of welcome to all delegates, alternates, field representatives and visiting members of URANTIA Brotherhood after which was heard an inspiring keynote address from James C. Mills, Vice-President of URANTIA Brotherhood.

There are nine Departmental Committees of URANTIA Brotherhood, and following the keynote address, the committee chairpersons repor-McNelly, his brother Jim and Bob Boden separa ted on the activities of their committee during the triennial period. Reports were then heard from the Field Representatives of URAN-TIA Brotherhood, each telling the assembly of the progress that has been made in each of the field areas in the last three years.



FANDORS

Winter's icy form has come upon us and we are all being asked to tighten our energy belts for a chilly season. Cars will spend more time in garages and less time on the road. Wouldn't it be nice to have a gasless fandor handy to do your travelling with? >> Fandors were used extensively by our early ancestors, but became extinct about thirty thousand years ago. Soaring high on outstretched wings, fandors could carry two full-sized passengers for a nonstop flight of over five hundred miles. Passenger birds are very affectionate and intelligent, and have a small but proficient vocabulary. On Jerusem, the transport birds fly at a speed of about one hundred miles an hour, about the speed of a two-seater airplane.

Fandors come from a large ostrich-like land bird that existed 45,000,000 years ago which stood ten feet high and laid a thirteen inch egg. Prior to that, the reptiles gave birth to the entire bird family in what the URANTIA Book calls the greatest single prehuman leap of evolution.

In Dalamatia, under the directorship of Bon, the fandors were raised and trained by the Board of Animal Domestication and Utilization. NEW CONCORDEX

Clyde Bedell's Concordex is something out of the ordinary. The title itself won't be found in any modern dictionary, but it seems to fit the character and flavor of the life-long effort which is now in a new revised edition. Located in the literary spectrum as a blending of "concordance" with "index", Clyde's masterpiece baffles The URANTIA Book reader with feats of logic and intellectual cross-fertilization that serve as a macroscopic-microscopic tour guide and study aid of the enormous text of The URANTIA Book.

Every concept and fact seems to be categorized in triplicate so that the Concordex ends up as more than simply a glossary of term references, but instead appears as a symbol sifter, a quote chaser, a fact finder, a truth testifier, and a meaning magnifier.

Piloting the certain mind through a foggy memory is flight controller Clyde's greatest pleasure. The more vague the notion, characteristically Urantian, the greater the chances of finding its source using the Concordex. Under key title headings are listed numerous references and connections especially under the titles: Jesus, Jesus Quotes, God, Truth, Jews, Thought Adjusters, Life, and Spirit.

The Concordex is also filled with a menagerie of adventures equipped with wizardlike gadgetry. Under the listing "Challenge" are not references to the use of "challenge" itself, but items from The

URANTIA Book Clyde feels are challenging to the reader. He has devised a code of abbreviations whereby we learn things like: "Spiritual: symmetry comes from H S, S of T, T A, 380 A."

This means, of course, from Holy Spirit, Son of Trinity, Thought Adjuster(s), from page 380 of The URANTIA Book on the top quarter of the page. A "B" would mean the second quarter, "C" the third and "D" the bottom.

Then there are some of the "post-Urantian concepts" like "Computer" and "T-V Television". If someone was looking up the source of a reference about anti-socially minded individuals and used the vernacular form "Beatnik", they would be led to 910 D where they belong.

There are many improvements in the second edition over the first. It is larger, more accurate, has a new and more informative introduction, and most of all, offers the A, B, C, D location guide. I had the pleasure of aiding Clyde, along with many others, in listing each reference with the new location guide.

Completing fifteen pages was a stimulating effort, but seemed nothing when matched with the editing and proofreading that went into the production of the Condordex itself.

The new edition is a must for dedicated students of The URANTIA Book who are looking up ideas for a purpose or just something out of the blue. Even if you have an old edition, the new issue is well worth the reinvestment.

How can we accomodate children in our adult study groups in a way that they too have the benefit from a study experience? Do we sacrifice our efforts, to concentrate on teaching them? Or do we farm them out to baby-sitters because to reach a compromise seems far too difficult?

As a Christian minister (nondenominational) I was searching for a more complete definition of spirit, both for my own enlightenment and also to find more specific information for another interested person. As doctrine, I had been taught that spirit was simply an activating force, but I was aware that the original Greek and Hebrew words had meanings that also included qualities of mind.

In the La Jolla, California public library I picked up a copy of The URANTIA Book and, flipping haphazardly through the pages, noticed a number of pages defining the Father's spirit as a fragment of himself that indwells our mind and "adjusts" our thoughts.

Aware that most of mankind's knowledge is only partial at best, I discovered that the Father, Son, and Spirit can truly function as a Trinity just as many religionists believe. At the same time my belief that Jesus was not the second person of this Trinity was also confirmed.

Similarly the new revelation corroborated my belief in the direct creation of Adam and Eve while convincingly broadening my understanding of man's evolutionary beginnings on this planet. Here again opposing views of science and religion were both shown to be partially correct. The book's explanation that man was the final result of a long series of sudden mutations that "Life Carriers," in cooperation with divine spirit, had designed as an inherent part of the original life implantations, thoroughly satisfied my theological logic.

This much enlightenment was sufficient to overcome the other two obstacles to my reading through the entire book. First, it was an unusually long book containing many scientific explanations that I thought probably wouldn't be very interesting. And second, it would require me to acquaint myself with what seemed to be a great many new terms with extensive definitions. Would it be worth my time? I decided to start at the beginning and read it at least as far as it would continue to hold my interest.

Accustomed to keeping close track of the time I spend on various projects, I began reading on March 16, 1972. By page 651 my notes had become so lengthy that I began to first consider the possibility of buying a copy of my own from a used book store. I was surprised to learn that used URANTIA Books sold quickly and that many of these dealers were acquainted with the book whereas most clerks in religious book stores had never heard of it.

About this time I also discovered the Concordex which not only contained far more exhaustive reference material but had it indexed for fast retrieval. After all the writing I had been doing, this would have been a real bargain for me at double the cost. Still, I bought the Concordex simply as an aid to revive my memory of the ideas I had read whether or not I ever finally did get a personal copy of The URANTIA Book. I just couldn't believe that the book could continue to sustain my interest for an additional 1,400 pages.

I noticed personal differences in writing style from paper to paper but no inconsistencies; minor differences of speculative opinion but no contradictions. The incidental fact that I found no typographical errors in such a long book also impressed me. It seemed almost too perfect. I felt sure I'd find some parts of it disappointing before I reached the last page. At the same time I found my interest intensifying. I even began praying at the end of each day that nothing unforeseen might happen to prevent me from reading the book through at least once.

Often I would read a statement that sounded so complex that I was sure it was beyond my understanding. Yet, invariably, throughout the book each succeeding paragraph continued to clarity the concept presented until it seemed that my mind could at least grasp hold of it with some degree of actual comprehension.

With the exception of a few book dealers and librarians, no one I spoke to knew about it and no one I met had read the book beyond more than a few pages. I searched in vain for book reviews and magazine articles about it. The thought suggested itself to me that I might be the only person on earth who had read it, because as a minister discussing many of the subjects the book contains, with thousands of individuals and hundreds of

congregations over a period of more than twenty years, no one had ever mentioned The URANTIA Book. Yet I couldn't believe that there wasn't a group of people somewhere who got together to talk about what they had read and how they could best put the information to use.

Alvin Kulieke, then President of the URANTIA Brotherhood, was the first to reply to my inquiries. The next letter was from Clyde Bedell who told me about the Los Angeles Society; through them my name was given to Captain Bill Hazzard in San Diego who invited me to the meetings at his home where, in turn, I met Betty Tackett — the individual who had donated the book that I discovered in the La Jolla Public Library. In discussing it, neither of us felt that my finding it had been just a chance occurrence.

MONEY ... THE ROOT OF ALL EVIL?

It was a great feat of social evolution when man was able to conceptualize his economic transactions into a standard medium of exchange. Requiring only a modicum of trust, money has made life more unified and diverse, aiding cooperation and introducing new items into a culture. The URANTIA Book points out that economics, in our modern culture, is the only thing that comes close to being an international language.

Far from being the necessary root of all evil, money serves as a circulation network for the social organism. It also is a mirror of man's intentions, reflecting the state of his own value orientation.

On the front page of a newspaper during the 1930's depression years, there were two similar stories. The first was about a poor man with a family who inherited five thousand dollars from a long lost uncle. The second was of a formerly wealthy man who committed suicide after he was told he was down to his last five thousand. The figures were the same, but the value that was attached differed.

Money as a metaphor was used frequently by Jesus in teaching advanced concepts of value to his followers. It was a bold pronouncement for his time for Jesus to exclaim that the widow's mite was a far greater offering before God than the larger token sums of the rich men.

This is not to mean that Jesus held the rich in disdain. He was as quick to commend the spiritually motivated rich as he was to condemn the materially minded poor. He did make the claim that it was, however, easier for a camel to get through the eye of a needle than it was for a rich man to get to heaven.

For years, the image of a giant camel trying to get through a needle puzzled my imagination, when, in a Bible history class at the University I attend, the parable was explained to me. It seems that Jesus was speaking, as usual, in the language and concepts familiar to the audience he was with at the time. The "eyes of the needle" were openings in the walls of large cities, such as Jerusalem, to allow the free flow of foot traffic in and out of the city when the main gates were closed for defensive purposes.

The "eyes" were three or four feet high; such that an invader on horseback could not enter. For a merchant with a camel to get through, all goods must be removed from the camel's back, carried through by hand, and then the beast must be coaxed to walk on its knees through the opening.

When Matadormus, a rich young man who was also a believer, sought to become one of the seventy gospel messengers, Jesus sought to deliver him from the love of his riches. Like the camel metaphor, the rich young man was required to unload the material burdens before he was to enter the gates of the heavenly kingdom. This injunction, it should be remembered, was for the apostles and the seventy evangelists only and did not apply to disciples and believers.

Jesus gave advice on wealth many times during his years of personal

ministry and public work. He knew how men can be obsessed with wealth and commented that where man's treasure was, there his heart would also be found. Morontia Mota explains that we are in possession of "personality credits" making our souls rich beyond belief.

The Master sought to use coins occasionally as an attention getting and teaching device. From the simple face of a coin he made clear the duties of the heavenly and earthly kingdoms. In the parable of the lost coin, he enjoined persistence and dedication in finding that which is lost in the dust and accumulation of time.

It is one of the hopes of the new Revelation that modern man be lifted from the bondage of having to believe in the redeemer-ransom concept. This material interpretation of Jesus' life mission, which portrays the Father in heaven as a stern creditor demanding payment, in blood no less, is an insult to his true nature as a friend who trusts us with his love to the extent that we give it daily interest, investing it in the hearts of our fellows, forgiving their debts even as our Father has forgiven ours.

What a bargain, then, is The URANTIA Book? For less than a penny a page, it can help the individual co-operate with the spirit of God to amass a treasure in heaven and discover the message of greatest value, that our God is a loving Father and that we are all his Universe Children.

The total number of A.M. and F.M. broadcasting outlets will be 874 including ships at sea.

The short programs will be carried over 63 stations in Germany, 27 in Canada, 13 in Greece and Crete, 10 on Guam, 21 in Italy, 9 in Japan, 3 in the Netherlands, 8 in the Philippines, 21 in Korea, 22 in Turkey, 5 in Taiwan, 3 in Cuba, 2 in Belgium, and 73 in Alaska.

This is the world's most powerful radio network -- more powerful than NBC, CBS, or ABC. This will bring the total number of stations carrying Vern's worldwide program to over one thousand.

Going Home to Father

As a college sophomore, I remember pondering the word "God." I couldn't think of what it should mean. It seemed just a word, with no referent, an invention of man. How could people even talk about "God?"

Then I remember hearing the idea that God is abscondite, hidden. He is nothing identifiable. One could only say what he is not. Sort of a black hole in space, maybe. But what use was that? I didn't care enough

to think.

Then I got interested in Eastern thought - in Brahman and atma, man merging with the universe oversoul through contemplation and self-identification with deity. That made a little more sense to me. But with it I threw out the idea of any specialized deity attribute of Jesus. Jesus was just a highly developed man of insight. We were all equal sons of God. What could be so special about Jesus?

My next step proved more fruitful. I began consulting the <u>I Ching</u>. Its philosophy became my ethical and moral foundation. I discovered the wisdom of self-restraint. I cultivated a sense of spiritual center. I saw that I was the creator of my destiny. I plugged my life leaks. My living efficiency rose. With a brother I revived a business of my elderly father. I found the young woman whom I wanted to marry. Providence smiled on me. I was working with life.

I have arrived at a point where the desire to harmonize with life, to know the universe will, was my rising intent. In reality I was searching for God. It was his cosmic eye that saw my Need. I found The URANTIA Book. Thank you Jay Newbern! For a year I picked

at it.

Its style entranced me - straight, flatout declaratory about the most enormous topics, universe organization and deity manifestation. I liked simple sentences with simple
truths, such as God never being subject to
surprise. I was intrigued with the foretaste
of those things which I would discover when I
reached Paradise and search the written records of the Beginning of things.

It was good science fiction, a great story, space age drama, and a masterpiece of

prose.

But deeper currents worked on me and within me. I read the first chapters on the Godhead simultaneously with a determined effort to rapidly complete the Jesus section, to understand the life and teachings of Jesus. The ideas of God and God-Man, Father and Son, Father-Brother, and God-Father grew within me. I revered the idea of God the Unknowable, the Absolute, descending to God the personal, into God-Man. I reveled in its fact: Jesus of Nazareth, Son of God, Son of Man. How perfectly right for the Infinite to come to man as man: a descending Son of God offering the helping hand, man to man. It made sense, a perfection of sense. God made sense. He spoke to us, as one of us. How right! How natural! How beautiful!

This idea isn't new with The URANTIA

Book, of course. But the incarnation idea
had always been linked in my recollection of
Christianity with the atonement: Christ crucified for our sins, the sins and guilt of

the whole world shifted onto an innocent lamb, to be crucified, whose blood was to be shed to appease the ruthless wrath of a stern and inflexible God of justice and punishment. That made me sick. I was relieved and heartened to find this idea sifted out and discarded as a remnant of the primitive tribal superstitions and beliefs of the Hebrews, an assault upon the perfection of the divine love, his unchanging love.

The URANTIA Book finally makes sense out of Jesus for me. Jesus makes sense. I believe him. And because of him I know something of the Father. What is God if not, at least, the Father of his children? a Father even as this Son so portrayed him! Yes, God is a person. What sense to a world of men endowed with personality, freewill, and deity aspiration? if not to herald the ever-ascending scale of personality realization - even to the ultimate discovery of the primal personality, the bestower of personality, the Universal Father!

So, what is God to me now? He is the one eternal reality. He is my Father, who wills the well-being of all his children, my brothers and sisters in spirit, and he desires that my will become as his will. He is what Jesus says he is. As a child, I was raised with some primitive ideas about him; as a student, I rejected them; and as an adult and as a Urantian, I accept him in his truth. I am a Christian. I am his faith son.

I see how the world is in need, as I was in need of a refreshened Christianity, shorn of its paganism and institutional barnacles, its shells and skeletons of creeds and rites and rules and ecclesiastical tickets to heaven. How we have waited these near two-thousand years for this cleansed message with its simple call to the worship and love of God in faith service to man.

But I find even more than this in The URANTIA Book. It is the resolution to every theological question I have ever entertained. I understand the source of sin in the world (which is not our racial guilt). Above all, I see an end to it. It is not far off. I see the cosmic drama of the Son of God come down to the least of his worlds, that nane might be lost. I see a glorious destiny for those who join in faith to follow his example. I see a new age. I see Christendom reigning in the hearts of all men. I see URANTIA reigning in the heavens, reborn. We have a destiny. A universe beholds us.

And most importantly, we have work at hand, to the fulfillment of which we can go in confidence that aught is in vain, that each vaguely perceptible step is one lasting step closer, that each day each victory of the divine through us is lasting, eternal, from the first, because we have willed it so, and so believe.

We go to inherit a never-ending, always-expanding universe, firm in the faith that human striving is not in vain, that man is no mistake, that eternity is ours insofar as we ever go forth to receive it. Thank you Father. Our hearts runneth over.

Who Are the Jesusonians?

I believe that everyone can easily accept the idea that the relationship of The URANTIA Book to the Religion of Jesus is that of matter to spirit, of symbol to experience, of map to territory, of impersonal to personal, of external to internal, of object to subject, of reflection to source, of doctrine to creativity. With this in mind, we can approach the question of how to delineate the functions and purposes of: (1) The URANTIA Book, (2) the URANTIA Foundation (3) the URANTIA Brotherhood, and (4) the Re-Where does ligion of Jesus and Jesusonians. the purpose of one end and the other begin? Where do they overlap? At one extreme on the spectrum is The URANTIA Book; at the other extreme is the spiritual, personal reality of the Religion of Jesus. Somewhere in between are the URANTIA Foundation and Brotherhood. I don't claim to fully know the answers to these questions, but I believe that the answers are of importance to the development of religion on our planet and consequently to the development of future civilization. A society can rise no higher than its God-concepts, which act as genes for social expression.

In the present task of spiritual gene implantation - revelation - there are at least two coordinate tasks. The first of these concerns The URANTIA Book itself: the transmission of the pure text to others. This task itself apparently breaks down into two aspects: the text and the teachings thereof. In connection with the text, there are the problems of printing, distribution, and protection. In connection with the teachings, there is the problem of the neutral, unbiased, nonpromotional presentation to others. As I understand it, this teaching of the teachings does not consist of advocating a new religion or making claims to religious and interpretive authority, but of presenting to others the contents of The U-RANTIA Book with as little personal coloring as possible. From what I can gather, I perceive that the URANTIA Foundation is concerned primarily with the text, and the UR-ANTIA Brotherhood is concerned primarily with the teaching and presentation of it. These functions must overlap in some way.

The second major task in the development of the revelation is, as I see it, the expression of oneself as a creative personality who is spirit-led. This involves thinking and saying things which are not necessarily quotes from The URANTIA Book. It involves the mixing of one's evolutionary life-patterns with the revelationary patterns so as to create a unique, ever-developing synthesis, a growing soul. In this process, one should of course strive never to think, say, or do anything which is not in harmony with the truths of The URANTIA Book, as one understands them. Nonetheless, in so striving, there will result a mixture of evolution and revelation in the developing individual, and this is the divine intent. Hence, while the text and teachings of The URANTIA Book should remain pure and impersonal, the impact of the revelation on the individual will naturally result in a personal mixture. This mixture of revelation and evolution is the goal of the Religion of Jesus, but this same mixture is not the focus in the task of presenting and transmitting The URANTIA Book. So at some point, the personalizing purpose of the Religion of Jesus transcends the impersonal purposes of the URANTIA Foundation and Brotherhood. Of course, it is best if Jesusonians present The URANTIA Book to others and transmit the pure text through time and space, but the scope of the Religion of Jesus goes far beyond the URANTIA purposes in the sense that the URRANTIA purposes emphasize the book while the Jesusonian purposes emphasize what the book is referring to. It is the difference between "here it is" and "here I am."

There ought to be the utmost harmony between these two phases, and yet they also ought to be distinct. As I see it, the basis of URANTIA Societies is the pure text of The URANTIA Book and the neutral teaching thereof, and the basis of the Religion of Jesus is the reality of personal experience of which the book speaks. The Religion of Jesus, while described to a degree in The URANTIA Book, is nevertheless not based upon the Religion of Jesus. Simply, the book itself is not those realities which it describes.

Whereas the revelation that is The U RANTIA Bookis an impersonal, external object in crystallized form, the meaning of revelation in the Religion of Jesus is that a continuous, never ending personal flow of revelation is within you at all times waiting even pleading - to be used. We each have our own individualized access to the very Source that is forever pouring forth new thoughtpatterns. No book is more eloquent about this than The URANTIA Book, which goes so far as to deny itself as the epitome of human philosophy and declares that the religious challenge of our age - not just a religious challenge but the religious challenge - is to construct a new philosophy of living. The URANTIA Book challenges us to go beyond it and put together an even better philosophy than what it provides!

The URANTIA Book does not point at itself as the answer to the world's problems; it points at us. It lays the obligation on living personalities who understand and accept what it is referring to. While The URANTIA Book is an essential link in the divine plan, it is but preparatory to the real work that lies ahead: revealing the union of God and man to others, just as Jesus did. The living reality of the union of God and man is of course not in The URANTIA Book.

The book is a basic training manual for those who choose the Jesusonian way.



A Note from Julia

Dear Friends:

I want to express a concern and some possible solutions for your consideration and reply. I realize that any discussion should be the composite thinking of many dedicated people and should be expressed to headquarters in Chicago.

In early days we were advised to form thousands of study groups and further, to avoid publicity. In this way people from all walks of life would become knowledgesible attack from unknowing individuals. Most of all, individuals' lives would be upstepped, enabling them, in their various walks of life, to grow wisely and upstep the lives of others.

Again: THOUSANDS of study groups before any publicity.

My concern is that of keeping a balance between the continued growth of modest, small study groups and the ever-growing big conferences.

ever-growing big conferences.

I love the joy, fellowship and presentations at these conferences and I have always been right in there working for them. However, now I am beginning to foresee some real dangers in the emphasis on and fast growth of

big conferences. They appear to be growing at a far faster rate than the smaller, in-the-home, grass roots study groups.

For example, we could easily anticipate a thousand people attending a national conference in the next two or three years. By contrast, we cannot count more than a hundred study groups in the whole world—and more than 55,000 books have been sold.

This is obviously an out-of-balance situation. The emphasis should return to small study groups.

Let's examine some possible hypothetical results of this out-of-balance situation and then set a course to try to correct it. Say that a thousand should attend one national conference. Our first reaction is "GREAT". However, let's think this through. 1,000 come with very little background and study group experience. There always exists a natural, emotional gust of enthusiasm which we all share.

A crowd that large and enthusiastic is newsworthy. I have been married to a newspaper man for twenty-five ly have been married to a newspaper man for twenty-five years and I know that a crowd that size will attract reporters. They will know nothing about the Book. They can only gather a few notes here and there, possibly from people who have had no deep training or interaction with others at small study groups in homes. The reporter may attend some in-between meetings at hotels or restaurants where—you can supply the rest of the possibil-

ities. How will all this come out in his hastily written articles for newspapers or magazines? You can just surmise (and pretty accurately) that it will do a great disservice to our newly organizing movement—yet in its infancy stage.


Great credit goes to our leaders in the Foundation and Brotherhood who have so far so successfully kept this quiet through twenty years. It is amazing and worthy that they have done so, and we must continue their good work.

Let's work toward the goal of thousands of study groups. My own stated goal is to be able to report at least 100 study groups from the west at the Triennial Conference in June, 1976 in Chicago. We cannot force study groups but we can help organize the existing enthusiastic individuals into small study groups thus attracting other readers and students and we can improve and upstep present small groups with sparks of new ideas and helps for improved study.

We would deeply appreciate your reactions and helps. We are all working for the Father and in the same loving family.

Reflections

He asked that we do this in remembrance of Him. He asked us to recall the life he lived among us and to remember that he is with us now. As was his manner, the Remembrance Supper was the utmost in simplicity.

This is the joyous celebration of a new dispensation of the bestowal of The Spirit of Truth to our world. This is a celebration of Brotherhood and Fatherhood. This is a celebration!

He would not tell us when to pray. He did not tell us when to have Remembrance Suppers. Many Uran-tians are moved to remember him this very special way on his birthday and Remembrance Suppers have become a special annual event. And yet, I am continually amazed by the number of long time students of The Life and Teachings of Jesus who rarely celebrate, in the good fellowship of brothers and sisters, the remembrance of Michael's bestowal life on URANTIA

I would like to share some personal reflections with you. I experienced my first Remembrance Supper three years ago at the home of Julia Fenderson, Field Representative for the URANTIA Brotherhood. (Note: I had The URANTIA Book for two years and somehow managed to miss the entire significance of Remembrance Suppers.) I was intrigued and delighted and wanted to know more about this unique experience.

Julia and I spent much time studying pages 1941, 1942, and 1943 of The URANTIA Book. (Notice how

many times they refer to Jesus as intending to institute

this new practice.)

I was and still am intrigued by the fact that we are told the Master is really present on all such occasionsand the words "really present" appear in those italicized letters which are used so rarely and so emphatically. Very interesting... I think they are trying to tell us something.

Another interesting item while we're on the subject-from time to time a Remembrance Supper would take place, and a day or two later we would discuss it in greater depth. Often Julia would remark: "But it still isn't right. There's more. I just know there is." And there was.

Example: Many times we noticed that certain individuals had a very difficult time expressing their thoughts out loud. Some were actually so nervous that the entire experience was quite uncomfortable. Often, as a means to break the tension, these individuals would try to say something humorous-which is fine. We should never become overly sanctimonious or grimly solemn, especially since there are so many beautifully humorous events in the life of Jesus.

However, what seemed to keep happening, is that these little anecdotes had nothing whatsoever to do with the Master, his life, or his teachings.

This problem was eliminated by simply stating at the beginning of the Remembrance Supper that is wasn't really necessary to say anything when the cup of re-membrance was handed to you. Rather than worrying about what to say, simply enjoy the experience, listen to the remembrances or prayers of those with you, relax into the silences when no one is speaking and try to feel the Master's presence.

When the cup is handed to you, speak if you are moved to speak-or commune silently within. Do what feels best and most natural for you.

Through the years Remembrance Suppers have become more Real, more meaningful, and more valuable simply because we were moved to have them more often. It was by sharing Remembrance Suppers that they evolved. Sharing Remembrance Suppers transformed purely social occasions into deeply moving experiences of fellowship and communion with the Divine. What a beautiful way to welcome new members into your study group and what a perfect way to personally introduce them to this practice, there in the warmth of your home!

At this writing we use water only since many people cannot or prefer not to drink wine. Many times we omit the use of bread.

We used to read certain incidents pertaining to Jesus' life directly from our URANTIA Books. we express these incidents in our own words.

We often have a period of group meditation and worship before the actual Remembrance Supper. This helps to center our thoughts and enables us to really focus our minds and energies. It also relaxes us and makes us more receptive to feeling Michael's presenc And above all, we take our time.

I strongly urge you to rediscover this practice and reconsider any negative feelings you may harbor. All Remembrance Suppers will be different. Great! Eacl and every one a new experience! The Master only sought to suggest the way when he instituted this practice.

He has passed the cup of Remembrance to us and i is now in our hands, waiting to be passed on to our brothers and sisters here today and down to the generations of all tomorrows. All of us sharing in the actual presence of Michael here and now--in this lifetimeon the world of his seventh and final bestowal, URAN-



Priorities in Loyalties

In discussion at the last FUSLA meeting, it was pointed out that there are many routes to the Father and that the "Eternal Verities" remain the same, whether or not we have The URANTIA Book.



To make my life a loving service,




God loves you...
