Bay Area Urantians Form New Society

A new URANTIA Society has been born. On February 8, 1976 at the Family of God headquarters in Berkeley, the San Francisco Bay Area URANTIA Society was formally invested as the planet's twelfth chartered URANTIA Society.

Two of those twelve never acted officially as Societies, so SFBAUS is, for all practical purposes, the tenth. In this connection, Brotherhood President Paul Snider remarked in jest that SFBAUS must therefore be a "decimal" society and must have some experimental purpose. (It remains to be seen just what sort of mutations may evolve.)

Dr. Prince Appointed Brotherhood Field Rep

In February, the URANTIA Brotherhood Executive Committee named a new Field Representative, Richard F. Prince, M.D. Dr. Prince thus joins a distinguished group of fewer than ten persons who bear that title throughout the world.

As a Field Representative, Dr. Prince will serve as liaison between Chicago and local groups in his own area currently San Diego, and wherever he may chance to travel.

A primary aim of the Field Representative is to encourage the formation of study groups, to follow up on inquiries from interested new readers, and generally to coordinate the activities of Urantians on a local level.

Technically, Field Representatives are not assigned to any geographical area and have an international responsibility. In practice, however, Dick will probably concentrate his efforts in California.

Dick is 31 years old, received his B.A. in Psychology from the University of Virginia in 1966 and his M D. from the Medical College of Virginia in 1970.

He is currently Staff Physician in the Emergency Department of Bay General Hospital in Chula Vista.

In a November, 1975 letter to Friends of the URANTIA Revelation, Tom Kendall, President of the URANTIA Foundation, noted: "In just 20 years, approximately 55,000 URANTIA Books have quietly found their way into circulation. During that same period, our office work has grown in volume to embrace interests and activities in countries all over the world."

In an accompanying letter, Paul Snider, President of the URANTIA Brotherhood, reported: "The work at headquarters has been increasing rapidly. Within the past year our small staff (2-1/2 paid and 2 volunteer) has answered about 2400 letters, 1500 phone calls, and has met with 450 visitors in addition to processing orders and shipping URANTIA Books on a regular basis to almost 1000 bookstores and many hundreds of individuals who order the book directly from Chicago."

A SALUTE TO FORMER FUSLANS

Urantians seem to move around a lot. (You'd know what we mean if you saw the revisions we have to make in our mailing list every three months!) Over the years, the First URANTIA Society of Los Angeles, FUSLA*, has admitted over 100 members, but only about fifty are locally active at the present time.

Five of the twenty-three members of the newly formed Bay Area Society, SFBAUS*, are former FUSLAns, who migrated northward to assist in the spiritual work at FOG*.

Now, with the forming of SFBAUS, (see front page article) it seems a fitting time to present short sketches of these five former FUSLAns.

This is the story of five people who dared to seek God's will in their lives, found it, and actually did it! *A few definitions may be helpful for those not familiar with these California groups:

FUSLA: The First URANTIA Society of Los Angeles.

For many years the only URANTIA Society in California. Publisher of this newsletter, the Agondonter.

SFBAUS: The San Francisco Bay Area URANTIA Society. California's second and only other URANTIA Society.

FOG: The Family of God Foundation, in Berkeley. Not an official URANTIA organization, but organized and staffed by Urantians. Produces the "On Campus" radio program. (Box 126, Berkeley, CA 94701)











Mary, 30, was introduced to The URANTIA Book in May of 1971. In October of that year, she came to Berkeley to visit the Family of God headquarters, along with Jo Ann Eichmann, Bob Blackstock, Kermit Anderson, and Scott Forsythe. (Kermit and Scott remain FUSLAns, the other three having become SFBAUSers.)

After serving for a time as FUSLA's Hospitality Chairman, she moved in August of 1972 to join FOG. She now teaches English as a second language at Armstrong College. At FOG she is in charge of mail—out of the radio tapes, a complicated and exacting process. She also helps edit the various FOG publications.

In 1974 she married Terry Echlin and the couple bought a house in Berkeley which they are refurbishing. An accomplished keyboard instrumentalist, Mary says she now has little time for hobbies, as her job, her commitments to home culture, and her work with the Family of God require her full attention.

Book in 1968, read the whole work over the next three years, met Julia Fenderson in 1971 and was installed into FUSLA on Jesus' birthday, August 21, 1971. She served FUSLA for a very short time before making an instant decision to move north to join FOG that same year. . . without a job. She quickly secured a good position with the Bay Area Rapid Transit, and is now a station agent.

Jo Ann has a degree from the University of California at Irvine, where she majored in Philosophy. She does correspondence counselling at FOG, and prepares FOG's quarterly report. Her interests include poetry, writing, and hot-air ballooning.

Jo Ann recently moved into an apartment building directly across the street from the FOG house, to be more convenient to her volunteer work there. (All "foggers" contribute their labor and talents on a strictly non-cash basis and quite a few live within a stone's throw of the old two-story house that is the FOG head-quarters.)

Bob Blacks tock, 41, has been reading The URANTIA Book since 1967. Of our five former FUSLAns he's been reading the Book the longest; he actually has a first printing, one of the first 10,000 Books printed. Yet, because he hasn't been in the Bay Area for a full year, he is the only one of the five who did not qualify to be a Founder of the new Society, SFBAUS. Ah, the tyrrany of rules!

An aspiring barrister, Bob received his Juris Doctor from Loyola in September of 1974, and moved to Berkeley to join FOG in June of 1975. (He had been planning the move for three years.) In October he married Sara Lindorfer, another Urantian and "fogger," and is now negotiating to buy a home.

Bob works in the Solano County Children's Shelter. He is interested in photography, and does most of the photography work for the Family of God Foundation.

Terry McCale, 29, found The URANTIA Book in 1971 and was for a short time a FUSLAn before coming to Berkeley, where he found work as the customer relations manager for a glass manufacturer.

Terry was previously active in gymnastics and water-skiing. He studied physical therapy and a variety of other subjects for five years at California State University at Sacramento.

Now he concentrates on outreach. Each Saturday morning, with Fred Shupp, he engages in campus ministry, and he produces art and graphics work for FOG publications. Terry is single, (and, he emphasizes, available).

"a day on campus"

Recently while on the Berkeley campus during one of our Saturday afternoon adventures* I found myself in the middle of a group of people trying to explain that God is a God of love and that he has a plan for each and every one of us.

For the most part, people were listening, and it seemed as though some were even interested in what I

was saving.

But as usual, there was a considerable amount of commotion coming from the crowd. It seems to me that some people actually come here every Saturday for the sheer enjoyment of disrupting our talks. I must admit that on this particular day they were in good form and the competition was tough.

Anyway I was right in the middle of a discourse so to speak when a loud voice from the crowd said, "Sit down, you are wasting your time; I don't believe God exists, nor

will I ever believe it!"

He asked me to prove that God exists. I asked him to

prove that he doesn't.

I began talking again, and after about three sentences this same person yelled, "I told you, I don't believe in God." To which I replied, "Would you please describe this God that you don't believe in."

*It is customary for Fred Shupp, Terry McCade, and several others of the Berkeley crew to engage in personal ministry, or what some would call "street preaching", each Saturday near the University's Sather Gate, at the busy intersection of Telegraph Avenue and Bancroft Street.

After hearing this awful description of our heavenly Father being an angry king with a lake of fire, etc., etc., I said, "Well, I don't blame you. If God were like that, I don't think I would believe in him either.

I continued to talk about the love of God, and just as I was saying that we are all infinitely valuable, this same man approached me again and asked, "How can you prove what you are saying? You are talking about something that is unreal. God doesn't exist."

To this I replied, "I challenge you to go off by your-self, and with a sincere heart and an open mind, to ask God if he is there. Actually say, 'God, if you are there, I want to know about it, and if you aren't, I want to know that too.'"

Then suddenly he went away, and I continued talking with the other people.

He walked up to me and looked me straight in the eye and said, "You know, I just tried what you told me to do, and I had to come back and tell you that I really believe God does exist, and to thank you for helping me to discover that."

Then I said, "Don't thank me, thank the Father!"

Well, needless to say, I was so surprised that I nearly fell over. This man really was searching for God, and as we all know, the Father will never let us down. This experience was every bit as rewarding to me as it was to the other man, because I walked away with one of the greatest feelings I have ever experienced:

Penetrates Middle East -- U.S. Blanketed

"On Campus", the radio program produced by the Berkeley-based Family of God Foundation, will now be

heard on Radio Jordan, a 100,000 watt short-wave station broadcasting from Amman.

This transmitter is King Hussain's primary outlet to the entire Middle East, reaching Israel, of course,

and as far as Egypt and into southern Europe.

In view of the fact that the station carries very little religious programming, and that "On Campus" was given a prime time spot (8:00 PM on Friday evenings) we can only conclude that it is God's will that the show's message now begin to reach the Arab world.

The program centers around taped spiritual encounters between Vern Grimsley, long time student of The URANTIA Book, and students on the University of California at Berkeley campus. The URANTIA Book is never mentioned or quoted, but its essential ideas of the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man are emphasized.

On the home front, "On Campus" now broadcasts from stations in all fifty states, North Dakota having recently been added, completing the "fifty states" campaign, a two-year effort by the Family of God staff to obtain full nationwide coverage for the program.

STUDY GROUPS ---- A SUGGESTED FORMAT

Experience with many study groups has shown that the following format is a common one, and one which seems to work well. Of course, each group should work out the variation that works best for them.

1. Assemble: (Have a set time and stick to it.)

2. Fellowship: (Until all members have arrived.)

3. Worship: (Silent or spontaneously aloud, to become centered and attuned preparatory to reading. Some groups join hands in a circle.)

4. Read: (See suggestions below.)

 Worship: (Give thanks, again silently or aloud. Some groups have a remembrance supper at this time.)

6. Refreshments and Fellowship.

7. Disband: (Stick to the agreed upon time.)

The following are possible approaches to reading, depending upon the newness of the group, member preferences, etc. Generally every person should have a chance to read.

Read the next paper in the Book, if you are attempting to read the Book straight through.

Read the next paper in series, such as the Thought Adjuster papers, the Religion papers, the Marriage Papers.

3. Read a paper agreed upon at the previous meeting

4. Read a paper agreed upon that night.

5. Each person reads his favorite passage or passages.

6. The "shishkabob" approach: read passages throughout the Book relating to a particular agreed upon theme, e.g., "loyalty", "decisions", "faith", etc.

7. The rotating group leader method: Each week a leader is assigned to choose a topic for the following week. During the week he prepares. At the meeting he assigns appropriate passages for reading and leads discussion.

We hope these ideas will help you have study groups that are intellectually stimulating, religiously helpful, and filled with the spirit of brotherhood.

Next there is your local URANTIA Society, FUSLA, SFBAUS, etc., the vehicle for expanding brotherhood on a personal level.



Greetings from the other side of the world!

This has been a tremendous experience and one of great joy-meeting all of these loving URANTIA Book readers who are sincerely trying to live the great teachings of the Book.

And prepare yourself--I have 14 study groups to report!

I landed in Sydney after a 21 hour flight. Christmas Eve our beloved young newlyweds, Jane and Phil Rolnick and I had a joyous fellowship and worship together. The next day they decided to drive to Adelaide and then fly from there to join me at Perth, clear across the country to the west coast on the Indian Ocean. We rented a car there as the Universal Brotherhood Inc. is 150 miles south of Perth in a place very difficult to get to.

The group at the Universal Brotherhood Inc. number about 100 young people—some married and with families who live in caravans around or above the main house.

The whole place is headed by Fred and Mary Robinson and a center core of about 8 people. They have 315 acres, with streams and a waterfall—sheep, goats, cows and gardens and orchards. They pay cash for everything and get their living from the land.

Really some bright people there reading the URANTIA Book, and we organized ten study groups under the regular organization they have, of rainbow colors. Each day Phil and Jane and I led study groups and Phil led music a lot, as they are all musically inclined with some really fine musicians among them. Two have been radio singers and I will get their tapes: Brian Peacock and Matt Taylor.

We stayed at a little hotel about ten miles away as there simply wasn't room for all of us at the farm, and we drove back and forth a couple of times a day, with a big musical after each evening meeting and a swim and picnic at the swimming hole on New Year's Day. This is midsummer--fresh vegetables and fresh fruit all sunripened.

These beautiful people extended $\underline{\text{every}}$ courtesy and kindness to us.




EDITORIAL ---

A cartoon appeared in the Summer, 1976 issue of the Agondonter depicting three concentric circles passing through the bars of a prison cell window, used to illustrate letter from a prisoner who is a reader of The URANTIA sook. Subsequently, a representative of URANTIA Foundation gently informed us that our cartoon was an improper use of the three concentric circle symbol, which is a registered mark of URANTIA Foundation.

The three concentric circle symbol must be reserved to identify official publications, activities and properties of URANTIA Foundation and its licensees.

The reason the Foundation is so alert to prevent the use of the symbol on cars, buildings, homes, vans, store-fronts, published materials, and manufactured items is that the public might mistake such vehicles, places, and material as officially representing URANTIA Foundation. This could create confusion.

Lesson. We would therefore remind our readers not to use the concentric circle symbol unless you first obtain written permission (license) from URANTIA Foundation, and that, if you are granted permission to use the symbol, that you use it properly: that is, without modification, and for identification purposes only.

A talk by Vern Grimsley, always a treat, was this afternoon entitled "Indomitable Courage and Unconquerable Faith." He challenged us to devote our efforts to helping bring the spiritual renaissance to Urantia.

After a break for socializing and enjoyment of a tasty array of food contributions, coordinated by Michael and Felice Long, the program resumed with Jeff Wattles acting out a lively cast of personalities to dramatize the Thinking vs. Feeling aspects of Worship.

Next came "Unification: The Eternal Quest," a multimedia presentation produced by Cosmic Pilgrim Productions under the direction of David and Sue Kantor. This production beautifully illustrates the personality as a unifier, and its unification in the life of Jesus.

In response to your request for suggestions on how to improve communications, here are some ideas:

- 1. Offer a complete list of study groups' addresses throughout the world.
- 2. Send an Agondonter free of charge to interested persons. Get names through present subscribers, book stores, URANTIA Foundation, URANTIA Brotherhood,
- 3. Write an article encouraging all study groups to intercommunicate, and all readers to pray for the new readers to be located.
- 4. Encourage more leadership within study groups. Many readers are much too passive. This revelation is snowballing and more leaders for new groups are absolutely essential. Remember the book indicates progress is indispensible. With the words of wisdom contained in the U. Book we can progress with subtle sagacity.
- Bring your publication closer to your readers (and save money) by using lighter-weight inexpensive paper. --Bob DeMatteis

Bob: Thanks for your ideas. Here is some feedback. We'd like to hear from other readers on these points too.

- 1. Good idea. But we are concerned about protecting people's privacy and preventing misuse of the list and possible detriment to the evolutionary spread of the revelation. Any ideas on safeguards? If we do make such a list, do you want to be included in it?
- 2. We already send a free copy to those who request it or are referred to us. But our mailing list grows, like the revelation itself, evolutionarily, by word of mouth
 - 3. OK, somebody, write an article and send it in!
 - 4. Agreed. Very important.
- 5. We've been considering cheaper paper. Also a smaller page size, perhaps 7 x 8-1/2 to fit into your URANTIA Book. (That would be nice for maps and study aids we plan for future issues, and for Study Group listings.) We've also thought of going to one-color printing, that is, blue instead of blue-and-black. How about it, readers? What do you think?


15 16 listrom Promotes to Next Stage

FUSLA Doings over the Summer

The First URANTIA Society of Los Angeles (FUSLA) holds monthly meetings for members, friends, and new-comers. Our format has generally been to meet from a about 2:00 until 4:00 o'clock on the first Sunday of the month. "Concepts of Art and Creativity in The URANTIA Book," followed by small group discussions (four groups of about ten people each) on the same topic.

SEPTEMBER: Kermit Anderson and Pat McNelly gave a combined presentation on "The Spiritual Conspiracy." During the group participation period, members of the audience shared interesting experiences of spiritual experiences in their lives.

OCTOBER: Twelve would-be Thespians produced a rather droll five-minute skit dramatizing page 1098 of The URANTIA Book, the well-loved cave-man passage. The cast consisted of Narrator, Caveman, Sabre-toothed tiger, Woman, two Children, and six Curtain Bearers. Bill Sherwood gave a short talk, and Chick Montgomery led a group discussion on the general subject of Understanding, Overcoming Resentment, and Learning to Love.

NEXT YEAR: No programs are planned yet, but our Education Chairman, Polly Friedman, promises that we will have good things happening, including the addition of live music at all of our monthly meetings.

ETERNITY: The details are as yet unrevealed, but we have been told by several people who claim to be close, personal friends of God that it is going to be out-of-sight, our present sight, that is.

How One Small Study Group Operates

Daniel St. Laurent has brought to our attention the letter "A Plea for More Small Study Groups"* that we took time to analyze. We are extremely happy that you brought up the subject of small study groups vs. large conferences as alternate approaches to a better understanding of The URANTIA Book.

Our small group in Montreal, three to five members, has discussed this matter and following are our thoughts.

Firstly, let us testify to the fact that our group operates under a very simple process. We simply get together for two to two-and-a-half hours once a week in a downtown room to read between four and seven pages of The URANTIA Book in French, but with a cross reading in English. We have started at the top of the Book, with the introduction. We take turns at reading out loud, paragraph by paragraph. As one or more of us has a comment, explanation, thought or "soul wave" we simply express it. This usually spurs about two to five minutes of intercommunications.

Within a two-hour period we probably spend forty minutes reading and eighty minutes studying and helping each

other better understand the reading.

We never or so seldom get into digression from our reading material that we virtually never exchange on any-

reading material that we virtually never exchange on anything but the Book's content.

We make it a point to read about five pages ahead of

We make it a point to read about five pages ahead of where we had stopped before the next session, so that we pre-read the material to be studied. We had all read most of the Book or all of it before joining the study group.

The experience has been on for six months so far, and we have all derived great pleasure, enthusiasm and spiritual comfort from it.

None of us attend these study group sessions either to go on an ego trip nor to teach the others. We merely help each other to better understand the Book.

In fact, we are gaining a much better understanding than when we read alone. We make new discoveries and we penetrate the Book and the "spirit" of the Book much better.

A very important additional dimension also occurs. We become totally involved, perfectly available, loving and helpful during the study sessions.

We clearly sense that we are not communicating with each other on an intellectual level only, but we are pene-

trated by a truly spiritual force and we often feel that it is our Thought Adjustor who is speaking to us and to each other.

We definitely think and know that this small study group approach is right.

According to us, The URANTIA Book is essentially a personal communication between the authors and individual man. The Book addresses the intellect, the material and the spiritual levels of man. But it must be read, in our opinion with a true desire to reach an increasingly higher level of spiritual thought.

Change, evolution, progression first happens or occurs within an individual, then automatically it will radiate within the individual's family, then friends, peer group, etc.

The URANTIA revelation and teachings are meant for individual communications and enlightenment. It will create evolution and change only if it is digested, if it becomes part of the reader's life and experience. It has to become an active process.

Large seminars, where you become a more or less passive listener, reacting only as part of a crowd, cannot produce as good results as small study groups, according to us.

Regional meetings and conferences can be helpful in:


- Having small group participants exchange on their growth experience.
- Helping to organize better means for dissemination of the Book and to make small study groups more efficient.
- 3. Allowing URANTIA readers to socialize.

Whatever is done to complement small study groups can only be profitable to individual readers and small study groups should be essential and be multiplied and encouraged.

The needs in ten, twenty or thirty years may call for different means, but right now, at least here in Montreal, study groups are probably the most helpful means to readers of The URANTIA Book.

With continuous work, patience and love, all will come.


Dr. Meredith J. Sprunger

As the Revelation Gathers Momentum ...

As The URANTIA Book enters its third decade of being abroad on the planet, what kinds of developments can we expect, and what should we do to prepare for them?

1. Many more books will be sold. We must be prepared for faster growth. During the first decade, fewer than ten thousand books were sold. During the second decade, just ended, fifty thousand more were sold (see chart). How many will be distributed during the next ten years? Even without any publicity, and assuming continued patient word-of-mouth expansion, it is entirely possible that half a million million or more books will be in circulation.

2. Many readers will be "coming out of the woodwork." We know of only one or two thousand people, world wide, who read The URANTIA Book. Where are those other 58,000 books? Are people reading them? It is quite common to have someone finally make contact with other readers after having read the book alone for a number of years. This will happen increasingly in the future as our communi-

cations improve.

3. There will be increasing unsolicited publicity. Despite our attempts to avoid publicity, there will be instances of unsolicited publicity in various forms, and these are likely to increase in number and in scope. Already several write-ups on the movement or its people have appeared in national magazines. (Notable examples include August, 1976 Oui, and August 20, 1976 New Times.)


4. There will be attempts to destroy the integrity of The URANTIA Book. We can expect increased instances of


unauthorized publication of abridgements, excerpts, and translations of the book, by well-meaning people unaware of the danger and folly of such a course.

Being ready. Of course anything is possible with this revelation, but in view of present trends and developments it would appear that the fulfillment of the above predictions is inevitable. What should we do to prepare?

- 1. We can make sure plenty of books are on hand to supply the growing demand. We had best leave the details of this to the Foundation, which has done the job so well in the past. If and when they need our help, they will let us know. At that time we should be ready to provide concrete assistance.
- 2. We can improve our organizations and communications to provide a framework within which to accommodate and welcome the rising stream of new readers. Specific suggestions of ways to do this are invited.

3 and 4. To anyone who approaches us proposing to do an article on the movement, or a review of The URANTIA Book, or who proposes to publish an excerpt or abridgement of the Book, we can explain the Foundation's position and then make the following suggestion: "In all fairness, shouldn't you read the entire Book before deciding to do this? And knowing of the Foundation's policy prohibiting your intended action, shouldn't you at least talk with them first to find out their reasons?" ——CMM





Experiencing The Spirit of Truth

Jesus, functioning as and through the Spirit of Truth, is, in part, a social experience. The apostles along with a large group of faithers were gathered together when Jesus' circuit first functioned on Urantia, and they were so excited by this experience that they stayed up all night talking and planning. Jesus was trying to dramatize this for us when he chose a social supper as the material symbol of his desire that we remember him.

On the other hand, prayer and worship, the attempted communion with the Father/Adjuster is a deeply personal and individual experience in which Jesus, as and in the Spirit, also participates.

I infer from all this that the "Spirit of Truth" is at once both a social and a solitary spirit, one that serves us throughout the entire range of mortal experience, from the good times and friendly laughter of a social supper to the most sublime and solitary individual worship experience. It is at once both a Brotherly and a Fatherly experience.

Tips on Personal Work

We are the recipients of a new and great revelation. The import of the appearance of The URANTIA Book is awesome. Those days are about over when few people had heard of the Book; more and more people are dimly aware that it exists.

What should be the attitude and conduct of each of us who are already acquainted and familiar with this epochal revelation, in explaining it to those who are not? Here are some tips on personal work that will help you in the work ahead:

- 1. First, redouble your efforts to become thoroughly familiar with the Book and its teachings, so that you can be sure to keep one jump ahead of those whom you will be called upon to teach...and you will have to deal with both sincere seekers and potential detractors.
- 2. Employ prayer and seek to know and follow the Father's will in the matter of revealing the Book to others. If you have your eyes open to it, you will discern that divine agencies are guiding you into apparently chance meetings. Make the best of them.
- 3. Be sincere. Frankly admit your ignorance and reservations where appropriate. This will make your affirmations all the more convincing.
- 4. Make it clear that you yourself are not a superhuman being. Some people constantly fantasize about such things. Emphasize your humanness by being friendly, sharing experiences, telling how you found the Book, etc.
- Be a worthy example of the Book. Avoid relating experiences or using language which you feel might be offensive to the inquirer.
- 6. Never attack the other person's beliefs. You will find that all belief systems contain at least a kernel of truth. Find that kernel, the essense of truth in the belief, acknowledge it, affirm it, and build on it, raising it to a higher truth, without ever attacking it. Always add something to a person's belief: never take anything away. If you simply can't handle what he is saying, tactfully change the subject to the God within him.

- 7. Be loving. Get to know a person before laying a URANTIA "trip" on him. Sometimes this happens quickly as immediate rapport sometimes develops. Still, it is best to know something about the person's background, beliefs, and aspirations. Think of him as a friend; not a project. He should be a friend. And your transmittal of truth to him should be the result of your seeing his need for truth, and your caring desire to fill that need because of the love you feel for him.
- Avoid the more esoteric teachings of The URANTIA Book. Use judgement in this based on ther person's background, interests, concerns and attitudes.
- 9. Give as much as can be received. Sometimes we know that God has sent a person to us who desperately needs to hear words of comfort and be encouraged to faith and we fail to speak up. We are too frightened, too busy, or too ashamed of the truth we bear. Be fearless!
- 10. Give no more than can be received. Sometimes, having mustered the courage to broach the spiritual subject, we press on too far. We go beyond the person's present ability to hear and understand, and we alienate him. For example, sometimes all a person needs to know is that God loves him and that he can follow Jesus for guidance. He may not need to know about The URANTIA
- 11. Be prayerful. At these important moments of personal work you should immediately establish contact with the higher powers within and around you, praying that your words will be gracious and effective, and the person receptive. And you should check in with God each time you reach an impasse, sense difficulty, or need words.
- 12. Follow up. If you have a potential "convert" to the URANTIA Book, see that he actually gets the book, read to him from it, explore it together. Assume the responsibility for guiding the new reader into an existing study group, or, if none exists nearby, study with him yourself, even if it must be by correspondence over the miles.

"How The URANTIA Book Found Me..."

Much of my life I had searched for a wholesome and non-contradictory form of truth which was both intellectually beautiful and spiritually invigorating. I couldn't find it. It had to find me.

About five years ago (I was 12) I made my break with standard Christian thought (Baptist). This was the beginning of a long struggle for truth. I began in ignorance, and of my own free will.

I still don't know exactly why I decided then to forge out on my own. I remember my first relationships with Jesus as being highly emotional and active.

Presently my thought evolved through: materialism, psychicism, witchcraft, spirit communication, satanism, polytheism, almost a year of nothingness, and then a period of 'free search' leading to my "discovery" of The URANTIA

September, 1975 marked the end of my spiritual melancholy, and around the beginning of November my 'truth antennas' were extended almost one hundred percent. I was really receptive to all that seemed good to me.

editorial...

In the last issue we mentioned the availability of a so-called "URANTIA Cookbook." Well, there is no such book, nor could there be legally, unless URANTIA Foundation endorsed it.

The error was due to my jumping to conclusions. It happened this way: A couple of years ago, while visiting Buck and Arlene Weimer I noticed some copies of a cookbook they had written and printed, entitled I believe the "Cosmic Cookbook." I was impressed but thought no more about it, and in fact had forgotten the name when, a few months ago, an Agondonter reader wrote asking for "the cookbook." I knew I wasn't handling it, and assumed it must be the one Buck and Arlene had done, so I printed the notice that anyone wanting the "URANTIA Cookbook" should write to them. How I came up with that name, I honestly don't know.

By the way, I saw Buck and Arlene at the Oklahoma Conference and they informed me that their cookbook is now sold out and they have no plans for reprinting it.

Now it turns out that some URANTIA Book readers are working on a different cookbook. However, if and when it becomes available, it will certainly not be called the "URANTIA Cookbook" since that name would imply publication or endorsement by URANTIA Foundation. It would in fact be illegal for an individual member or group of members (or non-members for that matter) to use that title, since the word URANTIA is a registered mark of URANTIA Foundation.

All this points up the necessity to double check facts before putting them in print, and underscores the wisdom of submitting all material to an Editorial Board prior to publication. We have such a policy at Agondonter, but I had slipped this notice in at the last minute, thinking it was of little consequence.

How wrong I was. It turned out that many people thought a precedent had been set permitting the unrestricted use of the word URANTIA. Such is not the case. The name URANTIA and the concentric circle symbol are registered marks used to identify official activities and publications of URANTIA Foundation.

The article you have just read (and everything else in this issue) has been approved by our editorial board, and if there are mistakes or misleading statements herein, blame group fallibility, but as for the cookbook error, I take full responsibility. ——Chick Montgomery

LETTER FROM A PRISONER

"truth came in bursts..."

"I've been in and out of prison like a yo-yo on a string, But don' knock me, baby, I'm just doin' my thing!" (Excerpt from my poem, "Walla Walla Willie")

And that's literally true; at forty-six I have been imprisoned well over twenty years. Lack of direction, poor understanding of spiritual values, and subsequent negative orientation were the principle reagents in my personal pot of problems.

Several years ago, Norm Chamberlain "turned me on" to The URANTIA Book. I glanced through it and put it down as a super-intellectual, contemporized and esoteric Bible. However, my glimpse of the History of Urantia and the Life of Jesus was a hook that could not be denied; I received a gift-copy from Norm while incarcerated in the Washington State Penitentiary at Walla Walla, and I got into the book with a passion. I was still not ready for the truth, beauty, and goodness revealed in the papers, and, although I was enthralled with the mind-blowing concepts contained in nearly every page, I thought of the book as a masterpiece of science-fiction, and failed to internalize its many positive messages. I gave my book away upon release and went about my usual business of getting back into prison.

During my 1972-1974 federal confinement, I purchased a copy of The URANTIA Book and spent over a year pouring over its pages. Took the book out with me. Carried it with me for a few days, but it interfered with my drinking, so I left it at the Halfway House and commenced my "normal pattern" of irresponsible, wild and drunken behaviour with the usual results. Caught a new bank robbery beef and am currently doing a seven year jolt.

About six months ago, I purchased another URANTIA Book and have been making it a practice to read a few pages every morning. Slowly, finally, the direction became evident to me: Onward - inward - upward. Onward through natural evolution of mind-body-spirit, inward toward the Thought Adjuster, the Father Fragment, and upward toward Havona through transcendence. Dimly, at first, but increasing in brilliance, the Light of Truth came in bursts, more and more frequent and intense as I humbly set my "mortal ego" aside and let the Spirit of Truth minister to me. I've always known what is right and what is wrong, but I really didn't understand-because I wasn't ready to understand. I am beginning to understand, now; and as I become more and more willing to let the Father's will be done, it is very evident that it is the will of our Father that we allow our Greater Selves, our Thought Adjusters, access to our mortal faculties so that the love of our Universal Father may be expressed through us in service to our fellow Urantians. I see no further "reason" to self-destruct. socially or physically or mentally or spiritually. When, at last, we find that there is nothing to fear in death, we then begin to live.


GOD IS!





I'm happy to tell you that Urantians are alive and well in Eugene and Marcola, and that since we are, it would be nice to write and tell you so!






